Minutes

The meeting was called to order by president Sharon Napshin. She introduced the other officers – vice president Charles Cayce, secretary Elsie McLaughlin, and treasurer Ray Bowyer. She repeated the mission quoted at the top of these minutes. Sharon introduced the officers at the head table as well as Rosemarie and Sarah.

Sharon reminded us the minutes of August 7 had been distributed after the meeting. She asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes as distributed. The minutes of August 7 were approved with the following corrections.

Ray Bowyer gave the treasurer's report. The balance is \$29,912. We are asking for a contribution of \$1.50 each day per resident for the holiday appreciation fund for the hourly staff. B level Elevator lobby had a new flooring installed.

Additional lighting was installed in the wood shop area.

The Fire sprinkler inspection was completed.

The upgrade to our door access/fob system was completed. As a reminder, the fobs are for resident use only. They are not to be shared with family/friends/other residents. This is for safety and security purposes. If a fob is being used by somebody other than the assigned person, it will be deactivated.

The intercom system that was temporarily disabled is now back up and running.

Projects still in process:

Replacement of the 2 pool roofs

Restoration of the balconies (this is purely cosmetic work and poses no safety hazard)

Installation of new a/v equipment replacement

Replacement of common area HVAC units

These are all large-scale projects that are being coordinated through our Regional and Corporate teams. More information will follow as it comes available.

Work in the garden area continues.

Caldwell Tree Service will be out within the next few weeks to remove some dead trees, trim up some trees, and reduce the height of the trees near the flag.

New seasonal flowers will also be going in within the next few weeks.

We are addressing the various issues with the WiFi in the community. We have experienced an increase in the usage and are working with our IT team to improve service.

We continue to focus on service in the dining room. Additional meetings, trainings, and leadership support is being provided to help improve the service you receive.

Emergency pull chords-in the event you need to activate your pull chord, please pull DOWN on the chord. A red light will appear on the pull station if you have activated it.

To maintain a safer environment in the dining room, walkers will need to be removed from the tables and walkway areas. Please work with the dining staff on keeping the dining area clear and safe.

All dog owners - please remember to be respectful of our green space and pick up after your pet. Dogs should be walked in the back area of the community and not in or around the front circle.
